Bird & Son, Inc. *125th Anniversary of Bird & Son, Inc.* Boston: McGrath-Sherrill Press, 1920.

This company history was published for the 125th anniversary of Bird & Son, Inc. in 1920. Includes photographs. Available for viewing at the Norwood Historical Society (Mss. 6, Bird & Son, Inc., b.1, f.2).

Fanning, Patricia. *Norwood: A History*, The Making of America Series. Charleston, SC: Arcadia Publishing, 2002.

This history includes chapters on Norwood's industrialization and 20th century businesses. This is the only book that covers Norwood history up to ca. 2000. Includes photographs. Very readable. Available at the Morrill Memorial Library and for purchase at the Norwood Historical Society and in bookstores.

Gilpatrick, Edward Malcolm. *Industrial History of Norwood*. MBA thesis, Boston University, 1939.

This MBA thesis on Norwood's industrial history (to ca. 1939) includes short (2-3 page) profiles of Norwood's major industries including the history, number of employees, payroll, products and locations. Available for viewing at the Norwood Historical Society.

Grove, John M. *Images of America: Norwood*. Charleston, SC: Arcadia Publishing, 2000.

This photographic history of Norwood includes a chapter on Norwood's early industries. Available at the Morrill Memorial Library and for purchase at the Norwood Historical Society and in bookstores.

Norwood Business Association. *Norwood: One of the Newest and Most Progressive Towns in Massachusetts*. Norwood, MA: Ambrose Bros. Printers, 1905.

Compiled and published by the Norwood Business Association and printed by the local Ambrose Bros. Printers (the same company that published the local newspaper, *The Norwood Messenger*), this book includes brief histories and photographs of many of the major businesses operational in Norwood in 1905. It also includes profiles of several prominent members of the Norwood Business Association and information on local churches, fraternal organizations and town departments. Available for viewing at the Norwood Historical Society (Mss. 1, Norwood Industries Collection, b.1, f.2).

Norwood Chamber of Commerce. *Fiftieth Anniversary, 1894-1944*. Norwood, MA, 1944. Norwood Collection, Morrill Memorial Library, Norwood, MA.

This booklet, published for the 50th anniversary of the Norwood Chamber of Commerce (previously the Norwood Business Association and Board of Trade) includes information

on the history of industry in Norwood, up to 1944. Available for viewing at the Morrill Memorial Library.

Norwood Civic Association. *The Civic Herald: Industrial Number*, vol. 4, November 1917.

This issue of the monthly publication from the Norwood Civic Association, *The Civic Herald*, focuses specifically on Norwood's industries. Included are 1-2 page descriptions of several of Norwood's extant industries in 1917, including the tanneries and presses. Available for viewing at the Norwood Historical Society (Mss. 1, Norwood Industries Collection, b.1, f.1).

Smith, George H., Jack Reddick and John F. Hardy. *The History of the Norwood Roofing Plant from 1904 to 2004*. Norwood, MA: 2004.

This photocopied history of the Bird & Son roofing plant (later CertainTeed) was written by three different employees in 1949, 1985 and 2004. Available for viewing at the Norwood Historical Society (Mss. 6, Bird & Son, Inc., b.1, f.6).

South Norwood Committee and the Norwood Historical Society. *Images of America: South Norwood*. Charleston, SC: Arcadia Publishing, 2004.

This photographic history of South Norwood includes a chapter on the industries of South Norwood and the residents who worked there. Available at the Morrill Memorial Library and for purchase at the Norwood Historical Society and in bookstores.

Tolles, Bryant Franklin, Jr., *Norwood: The Centennial History of a Massachusetts Town*. Norwood, MA: Norwood Printing Company, 1973.

Published for Norwood's centennial in 1972, this history of Norwood includes lots of information on industries and businesses in Norwood.
